## DBE PROGRAM for PALM BEACH COUNTY'S PUBLIC TRANSIT SYSTEM - PALM TRAN

Palm Beach County, through Palm Tran, as the operator of Palm Beach County's public transit system, has established a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program in accordance with regulations of the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), Code of Federal Regulation 49 CFR Part 26.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise is a federal program that ensures equal opportunity in transportation contracting markets, addresses the effects of discrimination in transportation contracting, and promotes increased participation in federally funded contracts by small, socially and economically disadvantaged businesses, including minority and women owned enterprises.

The DBE Certification Program is a Federal Program designed for business owners deemed "socially and economically disadvantaged".

## To achieve DBE status a business must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Must be an existing "for-profit" business that is currently operational;
- 2. Must meet the federal definition of a small business concern;
- 3. Must be an independent business which does not depend on its relationships with another firm or firms. If it is a subsidiary of a corporation, the business must still operate in a self-sufficient manner;
- 4. The qualifying owner(s) must meet the federal definition of "socially and economically disadvantaged" individuals;
- 5. The qualifying owner(s) must own a minimum of 51% of the company; and have an investment in their company;
- 6. The qualifying owner(s) cannot have a net worth that exceeds \$1.32 million (excluding the owner's business and primary residence);
- 7. The qualifying owner(s) must have day-to-day control of operations and possess an expertise in their work specialty.

**To apply for certification,** if your firm engages in or intents to engage in <u>road, highway</u> <u>or bridge planning</u>, design, construction or maintenance related to goods and services: Submit your DBE application to FDOT, regardless of your location in Florida.
